life Story

The Incredible Story of our Resident: Patricia Sansby

Born in Canterbury to parents Maurice Snr and Jo Price, Patricia was raised in beautiful Whitstable. She had two brothers, one older than her (Maurice Jnr) and one younger (Richard). Sadly, Maurice passed away when he was fairly young, however Richard now lives in France.

Patricia's father was in the Navy and after growing up in Whitstable, he was moved to Suffolk. Patricia went with him, however she disliked living in Suffolk compared to Whitstable. Whilst there, Patricia's parents strongly encouraged her to go to college and complete her GCE's. After 4 years, Patricia finished college and her family moved back to their family home in Whitstable.

Patricia had studied shorthand typing at college and when she returned to her family home, she applied for a job in Herne Bay with the Ministry of Pensions and Benefits. Other applicants went for the role, however due to Patricia having the GCE's in shorthand, she pipped them to the post. Patricia recalled her first day when she was shown to her own office overlooking the sea. She "couldn't believe her luck" as she was only 17 years old at this point. After 6 years in this role, Patricia decided to make a change and applied for a transfer to the Ministry of Defence. In her interview, she was asked where she would like to be posted, and she told them she would like to go somewhere in the Middle East. Shortly after, Patricia was sent to work in Baghdad. She was given her own flat and whilst out there she was well-supported and looked after.

Patricia lived there for a couple of years until 1967 when the Middle East war broke out. She was collected on a bus and taken to Iran so they could fly her home. All they were allowed was one suitcase, and whilst in Baghdad, she had purchased some lovely material for her wedding dress, which was all she could fit into her suitcase, meaning she had to leave a lot of her belongings behind.

Patricia had met her first husband John on a blind date set up by a friend. They got married when she returned to England and went on to have 3 children: Nick, Natalie and Matt. She now has 7 grandchildren and her son is a paramedic, which she is extremely proud of.

John worked in Saudi Arabia for a while and when Patricia was 7 months pregnant with Nick, she flew out to be with him, having her son out there. They lived out there until Nick was 2 years old and then returned home. Working hours in the Middle East were split days because of the heat. So, you would work in the morning and then go home for a couple of hours, then you would return to work to finish the day. Although Patricia didn't love this way of working, it meant that when John returned home from work, they could take Nick out for the afternoon. As Patricia had been in Saudi Arabia since Nick was born, none of the family had met him, so it was exciting to take him home and introduce them all to him.

Patricia worked extremely hard throughout her life and when she returned home and her children were a little bit older, she ran her own registered play group for 15 years and loved it. Patricia had remarried at this point to a police officer. She now gladly calls Chartwell House her home, and is very settled



Resident Recipe:

Gerald's lemon Brizzle Cake



55 mins

INGREDIENTS


- 225g/8oz unsalted butter softened, plus extra for areasina
- 225a/8oz caster sugar
- 4 free-range eggs
- 225a/8oz self-raisina flour
- 1 unwaxed lemon, zest and juice
- 85g/3oz icing sugar

METHOD

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180C/160C Fan/Gas 4. Grease a 900g/2lb loaf tin with a little butter and line with baking paper.
- 2. Tip the remaining butter and caster sugar into a food processor and blend for a few seconds. Add the eggs one at a time, blending after each one. Add the flour and lemon zest and blend until smooth.
- 3. Pour the batter into the lined baking tin, flatten the top with the back of a spoon, and bake for 50–55 minutes.
- 4. Meanwhile, stir together the lemon juice and icing sugar. When the cake has cooled a little, poke holes in the top using a skewer, chopstick or a piece of raw spaghetti. Drizzle over the icing, set aside for a few minutes, and serve.
