The Incredible Story of our Resident: Edna Clair Mead

Edna Clair Mead was born on 21st August 1936 in Kenton, Middlesex, to Gwynne and Elizabeth Sizer. Her father worked for Cable and Wireless, a role that took him across the world, while her mother served as an auxiliary nurse. Edna was the youngest of two children, with an older brother named Lewis.

The family later moved to Rayleigh in Essex, where Edna attended school. She was an enthusiastic student, with a particular passion for sport, excelling in events such as the long jump and relay racing. Unlike many children during the war, Edna remained at home and was not evacuated.

Edna's father was a member of the local Operatic Society, and she followed in his footsteps, having her voice trained and thoroughly enjoying her time as part of the society. She also formed two lifelong friendships with Mary and Thelma during her school years. The trio often went on holidays together with their husbands. Although Thelma has since passed away, Edna remains in contact with Mary.

After leaving school, Edna began working as a receptionist for a bus company in Southend. She fondly remembers the cheeky wolf whistles from bus drivers as she walked through the station.

It was at a dance that Edna met her husband, David. The couple married in 1962, and David worked for a luxury carpet retailer in London. Edna always ensured a hot meal was waiting for him after his long days at work.

Before having children, Edna took on various jobs, including working in a sweet shop. She recalls being dismissed for giving elderly customers extra sweets – a memory that still brings a smile.

Edna and David's first home was a bungalow in Benfleet, where they welcomed their daughter, Sharon. While pregnant with their son, Paul, the family moved to a house in Wickford, where they remained until David's passing from Alzheimer's in 2018.

Family holidays were a cherished tradition, with frequent trips to Norfolk and Somerset. Although they dreamed of retiring to Norfolk, it was a plan they never fulfilled. Edna has fond memories of cycling with Sharon to watch Paul play football, braving even the most challenging weather conditions.

Edna and David shared a wonderful marriage filled with shared passions. David was actively involved in the Wickford Horticultural Society, and the couple spent countless weekends gardening, growing fruit, vegetables, and flowers in their beautiful garden, complete with a long lawn and greenhouse.

They also joined the local bowls club, competing in singles competitions. However, their greatest passion was dancing, a joy they shared throughout their married life. Every Friday night, they could be found dancing with friends.

Edna was also a talented cook, known for her delicious Sunday dinners and meat pies. Her custard was a firm family favourite, loved by both her daughter and her husband.

After David's passing, Edna moved to Brampton Manor to be closer to her daughter, Sharon, who visits her every

Valda's Recipe:





INGREDIENTS

For the casings:

- 300a plain flour
- 150g butter
- 3tbs icing sugar
- 1 egg
- 1 tbs cold water

For the filling:

- 200g dried mixed fruit
- 50g brown sugar
- 50g suet
- 1 tsp mixed spice
- 7est of 1 clementine
- 2 tbsp brandy





METHOD

- 1. Preheat the oven to 200C/400F/Gas 6.
- 2.To make the sweet pastry, rub the flour, butter, sugar and egg together with a splash of cold water until it just comes together as a dough. Do not over work the dough. Wrap the pastry in cling film and set aside to chill in the fridge.
- 3. Roll out the pastry to a 3mm/1/8in thickness. With a round pastry cutter, cut out 6 x 9cm/3½in discs of pastry. Press the pastry into the muffin cups.
- 4. Combine all the filling ingredients in a bowl and stir well.
- 5. Cover and leave to soak for an hour (or overnight if you have time)
- 6. Fill each pastry cup with a good helping of the mincemeat mixture, so that it reaches three-quarters of the way up the side of the pastry-lined cup.
- 7. With a fluted pastry cutter, cut out $6 \times 8 \text{cm}/3\%$ in pastry circles for the lids (slightly bigger than the top of the muffin cups).
- 8. Place a lid on top of each pie and gently push down.
- 9. Bake for 20 minutes, then transfer to a wire rack to cool. Dust with icing sugar and serve warm with fresh cream.
